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COMMEMORTATING ANZAC DAY IN ISOLATION: 2020 GALLIPOLI ART PRIZE VIRTUAL TOUR



Gallipoli Art Prize 2020 Winner: Alison Mackay 'Breathe'

The Gallipoli Memorial Club have launched a virtual tour of this year's Gallipoli Art Prize, offering one innovative way for people to commemorate Anzac Day during coronavirus restrictions.

The online virtual tour can be accessed at https://www.gallipoliartprize.org.au/virtual-tour/. Viewers can 'walk through' through the exhibition of 35 finalist works in the exhibition space at Merrylands RSL and click on each work for more information and the artist's statement.

Now in its 15th year, The Gallipoli Art Prize invites artists to respond to the broad themes of loyalty, respect, love of country, courage and comradeship as expressed in the Gallipoli Club's creed. The works do not need to depict warfare, nor do they need to relate, directly or

indirectly, to any conflict.

THE GALLIPOLI MEMORIAL CLUB CREED: "We believe that within the community there exists an obligation for all to preserve the special qualities of loyalty, respect, love of country, courage and comradeship which were personified by the heroes of the Gallipoli Campaign and bequeathed to all humanity as a foundation for perpetual peace and universal freedom".

The works in the Gallipoli Art Prize often tell personal and emotional stories. Each artist responds differently to the Gallipoli Club's creed, making it a unique and diverse collection. The artworks are accompanied by an artist statement providing poignant insight into their work.

Included in the exhibition are Alison Mackay's powerful winning work 'Breathe' depicting nine gas masks from WWI and WWII. The work was created in response to the Gallipoli Club's creed and her harrowing personal experience of the recent bushfires on the NSW South Coast. The judges also highly commended 'The Telegram' by Lori Pensini of Boyup Brook, WA for her painting of a woman receiving devastating news via telegram and 'Major Smith's Petrichor' by Diedre Bean of Newcastle, NSW for her watercolour of L1A1 gas-operated semi-automatic rifle, the standard issue personal weapon for Australian soldiers during the Vietnam War.

"We are thrilled to be able to offer this exhibition for people to experience via a virtual tour using 360-degree photography. It has all come together very quickly and we would like to thank Merrylands RSL, all the artists and the hard-working team of creatives who have made this possible," said John Robertson, President of the Club and one of the judges of the prize.

"At a time when we are suffering great fear and loss worldwide, The Gallipoli Art Prize provides an important opportunity to reflect on periods of hardship in our collective history, including the 1919 influenza pandemic, and to commemorate those qualities that helped us through adversity."
